Strategic rail priorities (summary 1)

- Regular rail service beyond Ellesmere Port with a new station within the industrial area (Will refer to this later in presentation)
- Chester station additional capacity
- Chester North Wales Coast / Crewe / Warrington Manchester electrification and service frequency enhancement
- Direct connectivity between Wrexham, Manchester and Liverpool.
- Wrexham Bidston. At least 2 trains per hour, (Transport for Wales commitment) and through services for Liverpool

Strategic rail priorities (summary 2)

- Mid-Cheshire line 2 trains per hour
- Middlewich line service reinstatement and new stations
- Halton Curve 2 trains per hour
- Winsford, Hartford & Acton Bridge 2 trains per hour
- Improved airport connectivity
- Improved accessibility at stations

- New signage and branding


TfW's Station Improvement Vision. Customer facilities at Chester Station (3)

Progress:

 Overall, Transport for Wales report that the project is progressing well and due to be completed in Spring 2024.

Chester – rail services

 CW&C works closely with TfW, Network Rail, Liverpool City Region and other local authorities to build cases for frequency improvements for Wales cross border services, the Mid Cheshire line, Chester – Crewe and the Borderlands line.

• At Chester we are keen to ensure the station works for passengers and can meet future service aspirations.

Wrexham - Bidston rail line

- Concern that service disruption has resulted in many passengers changing travel habits away from this line and which may be difficult to recover.
- Transport for Wales Five Point Recovery Plan providing the foundations of improvement is underway.
- This is an example of the role of the rail user group having a major role of raising the profile of issues affecting passengers and helping secure responses.

Helsby, Ellesmere Port Route Upgrade (HEPRU 1)

- CW&C commissioned and submitted a Strategic Outline
 Business Case (SOBC) to the Department for Transport,
 presenting the case for re-introducing of a regular passenger
 rail service between Ellesmere Port and Helsby.
- The best performing option is extension of Merseyrail using battery powered trains
- To have a new station within the Ellesmere Port industrial area

Helsby, Ellesmere Port Route Upgrade (HEPRU 2)

- In April 2023, the Council arranged a site visit to the industrial area and a presentation to colleagues from the Liverpool City Region Combined Authority (LCRCA), Department for Transport, Network Rail and Northern Trains.
- Included visiting Encirc, Essar and Stellantis.
- Huge success in highlighting the scale of the industrial area and the pace of investment with a focus on carbon reduction

Helsby, Ellesmere Port Route Upgrade (HEPRU 3)

- CW&C commissioned a further report providing additional evidence to support the economic & strategic business case for Merseyrail extension.
- Demonstrating potential significant demand for this service, especially because a high proportion of workers reside in the Wirral area
- This is one option for Merseyrail extension that the LCRCA are considering, and an announcement is eagerly awaited.

Now cancelled - HS2 Phase 2b

The route through the borough of Cheshire West and Chester was to be:

- North from Crewe
- Passing the east of Winsford and west of Middlewich
- Passing east of Davenham, Rudheath and Lostock Gralam

There would have been high impacts in our borough (1)

- 3 borrow pits in Wimboldsley
- Train Depot Wimboldsley 9 year build
- Highways impacts Especially during construction
- Vast infrastructure Viaducts & embankments
- Community severance and change of character

There would have been high impacts in our borough (2)

 CW&C used the petitioning process of the hybrid Bill to seek a wide range of additional measures to help offset negative impacts on communities, businesses and the natural environment

 The Council demonstrated benefits of extending HS2 to Chester

There would have been significant benefits

In Cheshire and Warrington alone HS2 would:

- add £2 billion per annum to GVA,
- create 27,000 new jobs and
- deliver 6 million sq ft of new commercial floor space and 25,000 new homes.

HS2 Government announcement

Government statement:

"We will also provide an unprecedented £1 billion investment to fund the electrification of the North Wales Main Line, bringing parts of North Wales within an hour of Manchester. We will oversee more punctual, reliable journeys on the 126-mile route between Crewe, Warrington, Chester, Llandudno and Holyhead, where ferry services run to Dublin.

Local bus services – Bus Service Improvement Plan


- CW&C has been awarded £1.29m this year with a similar indicative allocation next year.
- Seeking clarification from DfT in terms of Network North announcement for Chester to Northwich bus services
- Welcome the extension of the £2 fare until December 2024
- Propose setting up a bus user group for the borough. Criteria for the group being finalised.
- We continue conversations with the Liverpool City Region Combined Authority in relation to the impacts of bus franchising on services in our borough



Transport Plan is over
a decade old,
meaning it is does not
reflect our current
priorities, address key
challenges or
changes to policy
direction.

What is Local Transport Plan 4?



An opportunity to make the case for transformative change to our transport network, to meet our net zero targets, poverty challenge and other strategic objectives.



A critical part of integrated policy making, aligning corporate planning (Borough Plan), spatial planning (Local Plan) and transport planning (Local Transport Plan).



Our 'shop front' for transport, a catalyst for attracting investment from central government and other funders to reach policy goals.



A major shift towards a vision-led approach to transport for the borough – which targets activity on realising a vision of the borough we want, rather than focusing on mitigating 'transport as transport's sake' forecasts.
